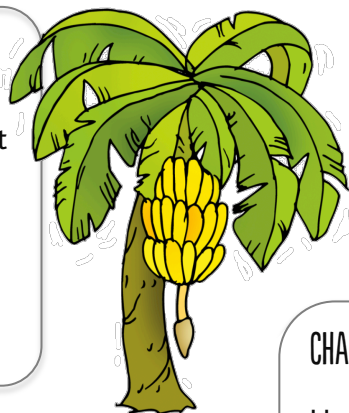




## INCREDIBLE EDIBLES

### Did you know?

Banana 'trees' are not actually true trees because they don't have woody trunks. The main stem of the banana plant grows horizontally underground and the part we think of as a 'trunk' is actually a group of leaves tightly wrapped together.

There are more than 1000 types of bananas grown in over 150 countries.

You can rub banana peel on your skin to soothe insect bites.

Banana stem fibres can be made into paper.

Experiment by adding other pulped fruits like strawberries and oranges into your mix.

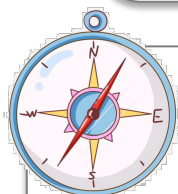


Different fruit trees flower or bear fruit at various times through the year. Please don't pick any fruit so that other visitors can enjoy seeing it too.

### CHALLENGE 2 – Play the Compass Crop Game

North, South, East or West – which direction is the best?

Ask someone to call out the name of a crop from the list below, then race to each side of the walled garden to discover its ideal growing site.

North facing: eggplants, capsicums, chillies, garlic, onions, cabbage

South facing: lettuce, peas, silverbeet, leeks, pak choi

East facing: radishes, courgette/zucchini, carrots, broccoli, NZ spinach

West facing: tomatoes, strawberries, beans, lettuce, parsley, fennel



### CHALLENGE 4 – Watch a wiggly worm



Worm farms provide our gardeners with free fertiliser to create healthy soil for our plants.

Open the worm farms to look for and hold some worms gently before returning them carefully and remember to wash your hands afterwards.
